Baguio is a 5-6 hours bus ride from Manila. Tourist coaches go to Banaue directly from Manila or Baguio City. Both destinations could also be reached via a one hour flight to San Fernando, La Union then a bus ride to either Baguio or Banaue.

Northern skyland

Blessed with cool climes, pine-clad hills and lush valleys, the northern mountain provinces have, for centuries, lured those intent on escaping the heat and humidity of the lowlands.

Baguio, the summer capital of the Philippines, is nestled on a plateau 1,400 metres above sea level. The scent of pines wafting from mist-covered hills, profusion of blooms and the promise of cozy nights by a fireplace in country inns make the city a popular holiday destination.

BAGUIO

BenCab Museum

Unique museum in beautiful setting owned by Benedicto Cabrera, one of the Philippines most renowned artists, housing his work s well as his collections of modern Filipino and tribal art.

Burnham Park

Iconic and beloved Baguio attraction dating back to 1904 with a man-made lake and wooded areas. Great for boating, biking, and skating.

Camp John Hay

Former rest and recreational facility for the American forces, now a country club complex complete with hotels, golf courses, private mountain lodges and restaurants.

Easter Weaving School

Watch tribal women weave rainbow-coloured threads into exquisite and intricate cloth, using indigenous back strap looms.

La Trinidad

Verdant valley five minutes from the city, dubbed as the salad bowl of the Philippines for its regular produce of greens and strawberries.

Mines View Park

Enjoy a breathtaking view of Benguet's gold and copper mines and the Cordillera Mountains.

Tam-Awan Village

An artists' village constructed with traditional huts carefully transplanted from tribal villages. Meet the local artists at the art gallery and workshop.



Farther up north is Banaue, tucked in rugged terrain brimming with spectacular scenery – breathtaking mountain ranges, ancient pine forests, tumbling waterfalls, and ferny glades. Carved out of the mountainsides by the Ifugao tribe folk more than 2,000 years ago is the World Heritage-listed Banaue Rice Terraces. Banaue is a popular base for adventurous forays into Ifugao country, idyllic Sagada and Bontoc.

BANAUE & ENVIRONS

Banaue Rice Terraces

Invariably called “giant stairway to the sky” and “eighth wonder of the world” the layered rice paddies provide one of the most awe-inspiring landscapes in the mountain provinces.

Batad Rice Terraces

Challenge yourself with a two-hour uphill hike to the village of Batad and you will be rewarded by the priceless sight of its amphitheatreshaped rice terraces.

Sagada

This picturesque town nestled among pine forests and limestone cliffs is a favourite destination of the bohemian crowd. It's also famous for the hanging tribal coffins wedged among the rocks in the forests.

Bontoc

Check out the museum and its collection of tribal artifacts and historic photographs. Up in the mountains is the cave containing the centuriesold Kabayan mummies.

- Baguio market, one of the liveliest and most colourful in the country, offers a wonderful mix of flowers, produce, indigenous craft and souvenirs
- for unique souvenir photos, catch the Ifugao men in tribal gear astride their wood carved scooters
- in Batad, watch the jaw-dropping sunrise over the rice terraces and enjoy a picnic and bracing dip at the Tappiya Falls
